Launching Brief

PHASE 1: FOUNDATION I FSSONS

Teach these lessons before launching **Read to Someone**:

- Check for understanding
- Choose a partner
- Choose a successful spot to work
- Sit EEKK (elbow to elbow, knee to knee)
 Coaching or time
- Choose one or two books to read
- I read, you read
- Voice level

PHASE 2: LAUNCH

Use the 10 Steps to Teaching and Learning Independence to launch Read to Someone:

- Identify what is to be taught: Read to Someone
- Set a purpose: Create a sense of urgency
 - Helps us improve our fluency
 - Helps us practice Check for understanding and comprehension
 - It is fun
- 3 Identify the behaviors of Read to Someone on I-chart.
- Model most-desirable behaviors
- Model least-desirable. then most-desirable behaviors (same student)
- Students check-in, only a pre-determined number of students can choose Read to Someone each

round (typically 6-8 or 2-3 partnerships).

- 7 Practice and build stamina
- 8 Stay out of the way; when necessary, confer and set behavior goals
- 9 Use a quiet signal—come back to group
- 10 Group check-in: "How did it go?" Graph stamina.

WHAT'S NEXT?

- With remainder of time in literacy block, continue to build stamina with Read to Self and Work on Writing as students participate in two rounds of Daily 5,
- checking in before each round. Begin teaching the foundation lessons of Word Work and Listen to Reading.
