Capture Thinking

Knowing different ways to capture your thoughts and choosing the tools that are meaningful to you are the first steps to writing in books.

- 1. Write in the margins.
- 2. Underline words and phrases.
- 3. Use sticky notes.
- 4. Use envelopes.
- 5. Highlight main segments.

Here are some ways of noting your engagement with a text. You may change your method, depending on your purpose for reading:

	NOTES	REMINDER
1	Write questions.	?
2	Write comments.	Comment
3	Write your observations.	Observation
4	Synthesize a section and write those few words.	Own Words
5	Jot important page numbers inside the cover.	# in Cover
6	Write about the text's connections to other materials.	Connection
7	Bracket sections that have quotable language.	<>
8	Sketch what you understand.	Picture
9	Make a numbered list. They stand out.	1-2-3
10	Underline passages with a squiggly line to indicate particularly interesting text.	~~~~~~
11	Star affirmations of your beliefs.	*
12	Invite a colleague to read and write in your books.	Friend
13	Write wow, for new learning.	wow
