Modeled and Interactive Writing

3 Benefits of Writing Aloud

- 1. Models the process of writing.
- 2. Models the conventions of writing.
- 3. Makes the struggle and problem solving of writing visible.

9 Ideas to Inspire Nrifers

3 Strategies for Generating Ideas

- Brainstorm/power writing—Brainstorm as a class or give students two minutes
 to list as many topics as they can think of to write about (people, places, things).
 Share, then brainstorm for one more minute.
- 2. Pictures—Pictures tell a story. Have a collection of magazine pictures or photographs for students to select from and write about.
- 3. Themed folders—Students write a story to match the cover of the folder.

3 Strategies for Going Deeper

- 1. Expand on brainstorm—Select one or two topics from the original brainstorm list and add specifics.
- 2. Use a Mentor text-Authors expand and add details.
- 3. Incorporate senses—Revisit writing to add what you see, hear, smell, taste, and touch.

3 Strategies for Collaboration

- 1. Google Docs and shared notebooks—Students can join their peers in writing and editing stories.
- 2. Class sharing—Focused share, specific to writing the writing goal or objective, leads to new ideas.
- 3. <u>"You should write about that!"</u>—Build awareness of potential writing opportunities.
