## Brief Focus Lesson

Abundant Easy Reading for Grade 4 Text: *My Librarian is a Camel* by Margriet Ruurs

CAFE Goal	Accuracy
CAFE Strategy	Abundant Easy Reading
<b>Observe/Relate</b> (1 – 2 min.)	What do you know about people who are librarians? I know some librarians here at school and at the library near my house. From talking to them, I know that they love, <i>truly love</i> , books. If you are ever looking for a certain book, be sure that you ask a librarian to help you. They know the titles and authors of a lot of books, too. Librarians know where all the books in the library are located. They can tell you about different authors and all kinds of books that you might like. Many of them even know about "good fit" books. Remember that librarians are wonderful friends to have!
Teach and Reinforce	<b>Establish purpose</b> – Today we are reviewing how to do abundant easy reading.
(2 – 3 min.)	<b>Create urgency</b> – We are reviewing how to do abundant easy reading because it is the best way to become a better reader.
	<b>Explicit teacher modeling</b> – When I talked to you about librarians, I thought of one of my favorite books. It is a book called <u>My Librarian is a Camel</u> by Margriet Ruurs. This exciting book tells about the different ways that librarians deliver books all over the world. Some transport books by boat, by train, or even by wheelbarrow. In various parts of the world, they may even use camels or elephants or donkeys to convey books to people who want to read. No matter how difficult it is, these librarians do everything that they can to deliver books to readers. In our school library, we can ask the librarians to help us find books; however, it's important to be able to find good fit books on our own. Using the I PICK way of finding good fit books is very helpful (Boushey & Moser, 2014). Listen as I read how a librarian in England delivers books using a wheelbarrow ( <i>read pages 12-13</i> ). As I read, think about whether you agree that it is a good fit book for me. <i>After reading that short excerpt of the book, ask</i> : Now that I shared some of the book with you, we'll review I PICK using <u>My Librarian is a Camel</u> .
	Do you know what the letter I stands for? It stands for I, meaning myself. I <b>look at the book</b> , <u>My Librarian is a Camel</u> . Everything about this book makes me want to read it. The title really captured my attention—how can a camel
