

Listen to Reading Brief

TEACHER PREPARATION

- Select materials
- Determine number of students per device

PHASE 1: FOUNDATION LESSONS

Teach these lessons before launching **Listen to Reading**:

- Introduce materials
- Material setup and material cleanup
- Listen and follow along

PHASE 2: LAUNCH

Use the 10 Steps to Teaching and Learning Independence to launch **Listen to Reading**:

- 1 Identify what is to be taught: **Listen to Reading**
- 2 Set a purpose: Create a sense of urgency
 - Helps us become better readers
 - Helps us learn and understand new words
 - It is fun
- 3 Identify the behaviors of **Listen to Reading** on I-chart. Sample I-chart:

Listen to Reading <i>Independent</i>	
STUDENTS	TEACHER
<p><i>Learn & understand new words</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Get materials out Get started quickly Listen the whole time May listen to another story if time Follow along using pictures and/or words Stay in one spot Listen quietly Put materials away neatly 	<p><i>Become a better reader</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Work with students

- 4 Model most-desirable behaviors
- 5 Model least-desirable, then most-desirable behaviors (same student)
- 6 Students check in; teacher places students around the room
- 7 Practice and build stamina
- 8 Stay out of the way; when necessary, confer and set behavior goals
- 9 Use a quiet signal—come back to group
- 10 Group check-in: “How did it go?” Graph stamina.
