When assessing your students using The 7 Steps from Assessment to Instruction, as you record the student's individual strategy or strategies you will be starting with in your CCPensieve, mark those strategies in the child's corresponding box on the spreadsheet.

When finished assessing the whole group, you can see other students who have the same goal, which would make for a natural small group, providing curricular coherence across small group and individual instruction. If you notice a multitude of students all needing the same strategy, this would be a good strategy to teach whole group.
