# One Big Rain: Poems for Every Season

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Twenty rain poems take us through the four seasons of the year.

### **Strategy Instruction Possibilites**

#### Comprehension:

- Make a picture or mental image (p.10).
  - o "This rain is long and cold and gray, yet sleeping roots are fed this way."
  - "Trees and bushes, nearly bare of leaves, now chains of raindrops wear along each twig."
- Check for understanding (p.8).
  - After reading the first stanza ask students, "What is the wailing sound of wind around?"
  - o In the second stanza, stop and ask, "What are bare, dead boughs? What does sway against my pane mean?"

#### Accuracy:

- Flip the sound (p.14).
  - o Focus on the short i and long i words, modeling this strategy.
    - pinging, stinging, tonight, bright, blinking, sunwinking, noonwind, brittle, clinking
- Chunk letters and sounds together (p.14)
  - o -ing ending
  - o sunwinking (sun/wink/ing)
  - o harvesting (har/vest/ing)

### Fluency:

- Adjust and apply different reading rates to match text (p.26).
  - "long muggy hanging day"
  - o "raindrops started so sparse"

## Expand Vocabulary:

- Use prior knowledge and context to predict and confirm meaning (p.14).
  - o pinging rain
  - o stinging sleet
  - o ice-bearing trees

This text can be used with nearly any strategy on the CAFE menu. The above strategies are a highlighted collection to use as a springboard for further instruction.
