Comprehension

I understand what I read

Strategies

- Check for understanding 9/10
- Back up and reread 9/30
- Use prior knowledge to connect with text 9/10
- Make and adjust predictions; use text to confirm 9/2
- Monitor and fix up
- Infer and support with evidence 2/10
- Make a picture or mental image
- Ask questions throughout the reading process
- Use text features (titles, headings, captions, graphic features)
- Summarize text; include sequence of main events
- Use main idea and supporting details to determine importance
- Determine and analyze author's purpose and support with text
- Recognize literacy elements (genre, plot, character, setting, problem/resolution, theme)
- Recognize and explain cause-and-effect relationships
- Compare and contrast within and between text

Accuracy

I can read the words

Strategies

- Cross checking . . . 9/2
- Do the pictures and/or words look right? Do they sound right? Do they make sense?
- Use the pictures . . . 9/2
- Do the words and pictures match?
- Use beginning and ending sounds 9/2
- Blend sounds; stretch and reread 9/2
- Flip the sound 9/2
- Chunk letters and sounds together 9/2
- Skip the word, then come back 9/2
- Trade a word/guess a word that makes sense 9/2

Fluency

I can read accurately, with expression, and understand what I read

Strategies

- Voracious reading 11/2
- Read appropriate-level texts that are a good fit 11/2
- Reread text 12/2
- Practice common sight words and high-frequency words 9/2
- Adjust and apply different reading rates to match text 12/2
- Use punctuation to enhance phrasing and prosody (end marks, commas, etc.)

Expand Vocabulary

I know, find, and use interesting words

Strategies

- Voracious reading
- Tune in to interesting words and use new vocabulary in speaking and writing 1/21
- Use pictures, illustrations, and diagrams
- Use word parts to determine the meaning of words (prefixes, suffixes, origins, abbreviations, etc.) 2/10
- Use prior knowledge and context to predict and confirm meaning
- Ask someone to define the word for you
- Use dictionaries, thesauruses, and glossaries as tools

Get started right away Stay in one spot Work quietly Read the whole time Increase stamina Select and read good-fit books
